

Education and Enforcement

Education of drivers may lead to changing traffic patterns which address concerns without the need for purchasing and installing any physical devices. Targeted enforcement can also alleviate concerns without physical devices.

Radar Devices

The city has a radar trailer and radar guns available for citizen use. These devices can be checked out, at no cost, from City Hall. The radar trailer can be placed anywhere in the city for a 24-hour period at a time and automatically displays to drivers their measured speed. The radar guns can be used by citizens while wearing the provided reflective vest to record drivers' speeds manually.

Citizens will be asked to monitor the trailer and record speeds over an hour period, or use the radar gun for a continuous hour, recording observed speeds. In some cases, these steps may alleviate the concern.



School Outreach

For concerns in and around schools, City staff can facilitate communication with school staff. The schools may be able to help spread the word of neighborhood concerns with vehicle speeds or yielding to crossing pedestrians through newsletters, PTA groups and school websites.

Print and Online Newsletters

Online publication of newsletters or targeted mailings within neighborhoods of printed newsletters which include concerns raised through the NTPP can be an effective education tool. These communications can be repeated periodically if found to be effective in alleviating concerns with traffic.

Temporary Signing

The City encourages the use of temporary measures to address concerns. Temporary signing, such as reminders to drivers of existing parking restrictions, can be effective, low-cost tools. Temporary signs also have the benefit of being visible when “new and different” but also not contributing to sign overcrowding once removed. They can be deployed multiple times if concerns persist.
