Notice is hereby given that sealed bid proposals will be received by Kenmore City Clerk at the Kenmore City Hall, 18120 68th Avenue NE, PO Box 82607, Kenmore, Washington, 98028. **Bids are due no later than 2:00 PM EXACTLY, Pacific local time**, according to the clock at the City's Front Reception Desk, March 28, 2017, at which time bids for the above referenced project will be opened and publicly read. Bid proposals received after this date and time will not be considered.

The City of Kenmore seeks a contractor to furnish all labor, materials and equipment necessary to complete the project referenced above. The work shall include, but is not limited to, furnishing all labor, equipment, and materials necessary for the removal of the existing undersized culvert and the furnishing and installation of a new culvert at the location where Little Swamp Creek crosses NE 192nd Street. The existing culvert consists of a 36-inch Corrugated Metal Pipe (CMP) and the proposed culvert will be a 60-ft long 14-ft x 7-ft (inside dimensions) precast 3-sided concrete box culvert with appurtenances. The proposed culvert is designed to address current flooding issues and will meet Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) fish passage requirements. As part of the culvert installation, approximately 200-ft of roadway will be replaced, and existing utilities will be rerouted as necessary. Additionally, 1,400-SF of streambed area will be regraded to improve areas of scour and sedimentation near the culvert. The project will impact 495-SF of critical areas buffer. After construction, these impacted areas will be revegetated by hydro-seeding or planted with native trees and shrubs to restore cover. Flow from Little Swamp Creek will be temporarily rerouted during construction using a pumped stream bypass and fish will be captured and removed from the work area. All work water-ward of the ordinary high water line shall be completed within the WDFW fish window as specified in the HPA. All activities associated with the project shall be performed in accordance with the attached Contract Plans, these Special Provisions and the Standard Specifications.

All bidding shall be based upon compliance with the Contract Plans and Contract Provisions.

The estimated construction cost: \$812,500.
