The 61st Ave NE and NE 181st Street Traffic Signal improved safety and access by creating a signalized intersection with ADA ramps and landings, sidewalk segments, lighting and crosswalks to help with traffic flow, neighborhood and business access and pedestrian crossings.

The NE 145th St and Juanita Drive NE Traffic Signal Project improved safety and access by creating a signalized intersection with ADA ramps and landings, sidewalk segments, lighting and crosswalks to help with traffic flow and pedestrian crossings and by accommodating past and future growth of the Bastyr University campus as well as access to St. Edward State Park.

6. If Right of Way has been acquired for a transportation project, please describe:

Right of Way was acquired for the 61st Ave NE and NE 181st Street Traffic Signal Project. The amount of Right of Way acquired was minimal to allow installation of ADA ramps, sidewalk, widen the intersection and add a northbound lane on 61st Ave NE.

A permanent easement (approximately 7 feet wide and 58 feet long) was acquired for the NE 145th Street and Juanita Drive Project to accommodate construction of a retaining wall.

61st/181st Traffic Signal Project: Affected persons included 1 elderly condo owner, 2 minority condo owners, 2 minority property owners; 1 elderly property owner.

NE 145th Street and Juanita Drive Project: None affected.

 The efforts that were made to address Limited English Proficiency issues (including use and cost of translators, outreach efforts for each reported activity).

61st/181st Traffic Signal Project: 1 owner had English as their second language. They could read, speak and understand English so there was no need for translators or outreach efforts.

NE 145th Street and Juanita Drive Project: No outreach efforts were necessary.

61st/181st Traffic Signal Project: Concerns raised included increased noise from construction and effects acquisition would have on property and business. All issues were worked through and resolved prior to construction. A mailbox location issue was resolved by the post office working directly with the property owner.

NE 145th Street and Juanita Drive Project: No concerns were raised.
