City of Kenmore receives Municipal Excellence Award from Association of Washington Cities

Kenmore, WA - Association of Washington Cities (AWC) presented the City of Kenmore with the 2015 **Award for Municipal Excellence for The Coolest City Hall** at AWC's annual conference in Wenatchee on June 26. Kenmore wanted to create a space for the community to gather and take part in the civic process. City Hall, which was completed in 2010, was designed with flexibility in mind to ensure it continues meeting the needs of residents as Kenmore continues to attract new growth. The building has also been recognized by the U.S. Green Building Council, who gave it a LEED Gold rating.

"The Association of Washington Cities recognizes the thoughtful, innovative and collaborate approach the City of Kenmore has taken, as demonstrated not only in this year's award, but by the fact that the City is the first city to ever receive three such awards," said Luann Hopkins, COO/Interim CEO of Association of Washington Cities.
