
Original ARPA Fund Allocations

CITY OF KENMORE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT (ARPA) FUNDING ALLOCATIONS

Updated May 2022



DIRECT CASH ASSISTANCE | APPROX. \$1.05 MILLION

Direct Cash assistance to low income households in Kenmore. The program served more than **415 households and 800 individuals.**

BUSINESS ASSISTANCE | \$250,000

\$75,000 Emergency grants to prevent closure of local small businesses \$175,000 Additional business assistance - details to be determined

AFFORDABLE HOUSING | \$3.2 MILLION

Donated City-owned land and committed \$3.2 million in ARPA funds to leverage another \$3 million in public funds from A Regional Coalition for Housing (ARCH)

HUMAN SERVICES FUNDING | \$250,000

Grant funding support to local and regional nonprofit organizations to help ensure residents have access to vital social and human services

CATCH UP LEARNING AND CHILD SUPPORT | \$100,000

Provide tutoring and support programs for kindergarten through 2nd grade students for basic skills and provide childcare funding support for parents

HOMELESSNESS RESPONSE PILOT PROGRAM | \$50,000

Fund a pilot program with a nonprofit partner to provide targeted outreach to Kenmore residents who are homeless or at risk of homelessness

PROGRAM STAFFING | \$800,000

Staff to manage ARPA programs 2021 - 2026

RESERVE FUNDS | \$275,000

Reserve funds for unexpected future pandemic-related needs

\$425,000 UNALLOCATED



The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) is a \$1.9 trillion federal law passed in March 2021 to help the U.S. respond to and recover from the COVID-19 pandemic. The City of Kenmore is receiving a total of \$6.4 million in ARPA funds.
